Jack's family goes to McDonald's for lunch and he sits with his parents while he eats his hamburger. Jack goes into the Playland for a while and then comes back out to sit down again and eat dessert. Jenny's spends the afternoon at the water park. Jenny sees her teacher there and introduces her father to the teacher. Jenny and her family go into Burger King and then into their hotel room. Jeremy is very excited about the comic book convention as he walks with his dad towards the convention center entrance. Inside, Jeremy gets even more excited when he sees an actor dressed up as Iron Man!

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Jeffrey is in the waiting room of the doctor's office playing his favorite action game on his PSP. He has just gotten to his highest level ever! A girl nearby is crying because she is afraid of getting her first shot.



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Taneesha has a great time playing outside at recess. She and her friend pretend they are super heroes. Then it starts raining and her class has indoor recess in the classroom. Jerry's baseball team plays in the Little League State Championship. Later, some of Jerry's team are playing baseball with a plastic ball and bat in Jerry's back yard. Jerry stops the game often to make sure his team is playing by the rules.

Fix the mistake!

At home, Becky, age 8, and her little brother like to pretend they are dogs when they play in the basement. On the school bus, Becky starts playing dogs with Alice, in the seat next to her.

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Fix the mistake!

Jerome, age 13, sees some 7-year-old boys rolling down the hill and laughing at the park. He starts rolling around with them and laughing loudly.



At the church party, Daniel greets his friend by knuckle bumping, his minister by saying, "What's up, dude?" and his grandfather by shaking his hand and giving him a hug. Alice, age 11, is with her mom at the hairdresser. She lies down on the couch in the waiting room and plays her PSP. When they leave, she tells the hairdressers, "Nice seeing you all. Bye."

Fix the mistake!

Brad has arrived at the birthday party at Dave and Busters. He says "Thanks for the nice party" to the mom. Waiting to ride the go carts, he introduces himself to a boy: "How do you do. My name is Brad" and shakes his hand.

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Fix the mistake!

Serena, age 9, watches funny Youtube videos after breakfast and then laughs about them with her dad on the way to school. During lunch, she and her friends are laughing about the videos so hard they can't swallow.



Sam is trying hard to get more friends. He lets someone eat some of his chips at lunch. He obeys the older kids who ask him to dance and sing like Michael Jackson for the girls, and he knows he is doing well because everybody laughs.



Tell about a time with your family away from home when you were on Level 1 (Silly) when you should have been on Level 3 (Kind of Serious) or 4 (Serious). Tell about a time **at your house** when were on a Level 1 (Silly) when you should have been on a Level 3 (Kind of Serious) or 4 (Serious).

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Tell about a time you saw other kids acting too silly and they needed to calm down.





When your are feeling very silly and hyper at home, what are some things you are allowed to do to enjoy yourself?



Tell about a time when you were in a Level 4 (Serious) situation. What was the hardest part for you? How did you get through it? Your own Life

Ask the adult with you to tell about a time when you were being too silly and not serious enough.

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Ask the adult with you to give you a suggestion on how to calm down if you are feeling too "hyper."





- Your best friend has come over to play. How do you say hello and goodbye?
- Your mother has some friends over at the house to play cards. How do you say hello and goodbye?



Pretend you are the mom or dad for a kid your age. You notice your son/daughter is saying goodbye to their uncle by saying, "Later, bro!" What should you say?



The adult will pretend that he/she is an adult guest in your classroom who has come to teach the kids about the zoo. You need to: Greet this person, thank this person, say goodbye to this person.

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You and the adult with you will pretend now. YOU will play the adult, and the adult will play YOU. The adult (playing YOU) will make **one** of these mistakes: Asking personal questions, acting too silly, saying hello the wrong way, or saying goodbye the wrong way. **CAN YOU SPOT THE MISTAKE?**



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Pretend that you are the librarian in the **Children's Department at the library**. Explain how children are supposed to behave at the library.

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Pretend you are a parent who has brought a 12year-old to a certain park they last visited when he was seven. Explain to the twelve-year-old about:

- If he can still walk around pretending to be a train
- If he can play in the sandbox with 7-yearolds



Pretend that you are a mom or day helping your son or daughter with a problem. Your son/daughter is trying to make friends by making others laugh, but does not understand that the "friends" just think he is acting foolish.

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Pretend you are a classroom teacher. Explain to a new student:

- When during the school day kids are allowed to behave like Level 1 or 2.
- Explain when during a school day they must act like Level 3 and 4.
